

The Governor signed an executive order to enable local water agencies and other water users to capture water from the latest round of storms to recharge state groundwater supplies. "California is seeing extreme rain and snow, so we're making it simple to redirect water to recharge groundwater basins. This order helps us take advantage of expected intense storms and increases state support for local stormwater capture efforts."







Lake Mendocino Storage





Multiple Rounds of Rain and Gusty Ridgetop Winds through Tuesday

Heavy rain showers and gusty ridgetop winds will spread across the area Monday. A second round of heavy rain and gusty winds is expected for Tuesday. Some rivers are forecast to exceed Flood Stage.

KEY POINTS

- Increasing threat for nuisance urban and small stream flooding starting today
- Atmospheric river to bring heavy rain, strong winds, and flooding Monday into Tuesday
- Rain and snow melt will increase runoff in Trinity County
- Some rivers are forecast to exceed flood stage by Tuesday
